ganda-born and raised organist Patrick Kabanda will give his Canadian debut recital in Brandon.

"I learned about the Prairies in Canada when I was taking geography in high school in Uganda. I've never been to Canada and I'm looking forward to my visit there," he said from his office in Andover, Mass

In the early 1980s, at the age of eight, he began to sing in the Namirembe Cathedral choir in Kampala. Soon after, he found himself intrigued by the organ.

"I thought it was such a cool instrument and it triggered my interest," Kabanda said.


The choir program also offered reading music, solfège, ear training and keyboard skills, which he developed even more on his own. In his late teens, to raise money for his education, he played the piano at the Sheraton Hotel in Kampala.

His talent was recognized by an American tourist at the hotel, and consequently, he was offered a scholarship to study at Brevard College in North Carolina in 1996.

He has been in North America ever since.

A graduate of The Juilliard School, where he received both a bachelor and a master of music degrees, Kabanda has been performing in prestigious venues in the United States, England, South Africa and he now teaches music at Phillips Academy, in Andover.
